CHANGE DOESN'T HAPPEN ALONI

We know that our community's issues are broad and vast; they're an enormous challenge for one single nonprofit to address. We also know many of these issues are interrelated-issues like health concerns, educational road blocks, and financial struggles. United Way elevates these issues and calls everyone in our four-county region to action.

United Way fights...

- ...for literacy. Since 2015, over 277,370 books have been distributed to children through My Very Own Library and Build My Bookshelf. An average of 6,639 students per year have received books with a total investment of \$1.5 million.
- ...for the basic needs of individuals in the community. Since 2009, over 425,000 individuals and families struggling to meet their basic needs received food, transportation, legal, and housing assistance at the most vulnerable time of their lives.
- ...for the safety of people experiencing intimate partner violence. Since 2009, an average of 9,500 people were served per year in intimate partner violence prevention programs with 96% gaining knowledge about safety planning and their rights and options in the legal system.
- ...for the health and safety of our nonprofits and the people they serve. In response to COVID-19, United Way supplied over 450 gallons of hand sanitizer, over 52,300 masks and gloves, over 19,200 personal hygiene products, over 2,900 cleaning supply products, over 13,500 food items, over 43,000 food pantry supplies (plates, forks, napkins, utensils), nearly 72,000 diapers, 10 hooded antiviral suits, and over 1,100 digital no-touch thermometers to local nonprofits

United Way convenes resources, volunteers, experts, and other service providers for short-term relief and long-term success.
