

PIPER NEEDED RELIABLE TRANSPORTATION

After her old car broke down, Piper remembers taking the bus to work. Leaving at 3 o'clock in the morning meant Piper walked the mile to the bus stop in the pitch black.

Winter weather and late busses meant Piper often missed days or was late for work. "If I had missed one paycheck, my daughter and I would have been homeless," she said. "I had to find a way to keep my job."

A friend told Piper about the United Way-funded Auto Loan Access Program at YWCA Southeast Wisconsin. Piper was nervous she wouldn't be eligible, but decided to give it a try.
